A family-run Italian firm now in the hands of the third generation, which enjoys very close links with the area in which it was founded and where it has grown into the strong international concern that we know today.

This, in a nutshell, is <u>LATI</u>, a company founded over 75 years ago by the grandfather of Michela Conterno, the current CEO — a company that, over the years, has witnessed a series of generational handovers, also amongst its staff.
